Food on Tables: Additional food assistance is now available for over 41 million Americans who are relying on SNAP benefits and 17.1 million children who need Pandemic EBT because of the barriers to receiving school meals.

• This means a family of four is now receiving an extra \$100 per month in SNAP benefits and \$6.82 per child per day in P-EBT.
