But all summer, he demanded schools reopen, telling the American people that children were <u>"almost immune."</u>

U.S. cases top 5 million, with more than 163,000 deaths.<sup>28</sup>

The American Academy of Pediatrics and Children's Hospital Association report a 90% increase in the number of child COVID-19 cases from July to August.<sup>29</sup>

Today, the United States has 6.3 million confirmed cases and nearly 200,000 deaths.

Over <u>half a million</u> children have tested positive for COVID-19.

At least 29 million people are still out of work.

And millions of families are facing severe hardship.
