4 **SEC. 50001. CYBERSECURITY AND INFRASTRUCTURE SECU-**  
5 **RITY AGENCY.**

6 (a) IMPROVING CYBERSECURITY.—In addition to  
7 amounts otherwise made available, there is appropriated  
8 to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency  
9 for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury  
10 not otherwise appropriated, \$100,000,000, to remain  
11 available until September 30, 2031, for cybersecurity risk  
12 mitigation.

13 (b) CETAP.—In addition to amounts otherwise made  
14 available, there is appropriated to the Cybersecurity and  
15 Infrastructure Security Agency for fiscal year 2022, out  
16 of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,  
17 \$15,000,000, to remain available until September 30,  
18 2031, for the Cybersecurity Education and Training As-  
19 sistance Program, Federal assistance grants under the Cy-  
20 bersecurity Education and Training Assistance Program,  
21 and necessary mission support activities.

22 (c) CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS, TRAINING, AND  
23 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT.—In addition to amounts

1 otherwise made available, there is appropriated to the Cy-  
2 bersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency for fiscal  
3 year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise  
4 appropriated, \$100,000,000, to remain available until  
5 September 30, 2031, for improving cybersecurity aware-  
6 ness, training, and workforce development, including nec-  
7 essary mission support activities.

8 (d) MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION.—In addi-  
9 tion to amounts otherwise made available, there is appro-  
10 priated to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security  
11 Agency for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the  
12 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$2,500,000, to re-  
13 main available until September 30, 2031, for management  
14 and administration.

15 (e) MULTI-STATE INFORMATION SHARING AND  
16 ANALYSIS CENTER.—In addition to amounts otherwise  
17 made available, there is appropriated to the Cybersecurity  
18 and Infrastructure Security Agency for fiscal year 2022,  
19 out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appro-  
20 priated, \$35,000,000, to remain available until September  
21 30, 2031, for Federal assistance through cooperative  
22 agreements with the Multi-State Information Sharing and  
23 Analysis Center.

24 (f) CYBERSENTRY.—In addition to amounts other-  
25 wise made available, there is appropriated to the Cyberse-

1 curity and Infrastructure Security Agency for fiscal year  
2 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise ap-  
3 propriated, \$50,000,000, to remain available until Sep-  
4 tember 30, 2031, for the purpose of protecting critical in-  
5 frastructure industrial control systems and executing the  
6 CyberSentry program.

7 (g) CLOUD SECURITY.—In addition to amounts oth-  
8 erwise made available, there is appropriated to the Cyber-  
9 security and Infrastructure Security Agency for fiscal year  
10 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise ap-  
11 propriated, \$50,000,000, to remain available until Sep-  
12 tember 30, 2031, for the purpose of executing the secure  
13 cloud architecture activities, migration advisory services,  
14 and cloud threat hunting capabilities of the Cybersecurity  
15 and Infrastructure Security Agency.

16 (h) INDUSTRIAL CONTROL SYSTEMS SECURITY.—In  
17 addition to amounts otherwise made available, there is ap-  
18 propriated to the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Secu-  
19 rity Agency for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the  
20 Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$50,000,000, to re-  
21 main available until September 30, 2031, for the purpose  
22 of researching and developing the means by which to se-  
23 cure operational technology and industrial control systems  
24 against security vulnerabilities (as such term is defined

1 in section 102(17) of the Cybersecurity Information Shar-  
2 ing Act of 2015 (6 U.S.C. 1501(17)).

3 **SEC. 50002. FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY.**

4 (a) STATE AND LOCAL CYBERSECURITY RECRUIT-  
5 MENT AND TRAINING.—In addition to amounts otherwise  
6 made available, there is appropriated for fiscal year 2022,  
7 out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appro-  
8 priated, \$75,000,000, to remain available until September  
9 30, 2031, to the Administrator of the Federal Emergency  
10 Management Agency, in consultation with the Director of  
11 the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency, to  
12 award grants, contracts, or cooperative agreements to  
13 State, local, Tribal, and territorial governments for cyber-  
14 security recruitment and training to enhance efforts to ad-  
15 dress cybersecurity risks (as defined in paragraph (2) of  
16 section 2201 of the Homeland Security Act) and cyberse-  
17 curity threats (as defined in paragraph (3) of section 2201  
18 of the Homeland Security Act).

19 (b) MIGRATION TO .GOV DOMAIN.—In addition to  
20 amounts otherwise made available, there is appropriated  
21 for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury  
22 not otherwise appropriated, \$20,000,000, to remain avail-  
23 able until September 30, 2031, to the Administrator of  
24 the Federal Emergency Management Agency, in consulta-  
25 tion with the Director of the Cybersecurity and Infrastruc-

1 ture Security Agency, to award grants, contracts, or coop-  
2 erative agreements to State, local, Tribal, and territorial  
3 governments to carry out activities to migrate the online  
4 services of such governments to the .gov internet domain.

5 (c) LIMITATION.—The Administrator of the Federal  
6 Emergency Management Agency may not use amounts ap-  
7 propriated under this section for activities under the Na-  
8 tional Flood Insurance Act of 1968 or a function of the  
9 Federal Emergency Management Agency relating to that  
10 Act.

11 **SEC. 50003. SECURITY GRANT PROGRAMS.**

12 (a) URBAN AREA SECURITY INITIATIVE.—In addi-  
13 tion to amounts otherwise available, there is appropriated  
14 for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury  
15 not otherwise appropriated, \$47,500,000, to remain avail-  
16 able until September 30, 2031, to the Administrator of  
17 Federal Emergency Management Agency for the Non-  
18 profit Security Grant Program for grants to nonprofits  
19 under the Urban Area Security Initiative.

20 (b) STATE HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PRO-  
21 GRAM.—In addition to amounts otherwise available, there  
22 is appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in  
23 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$47,500,000, to  
24 remain available until September 30, 2031, to the Admin-  
25 istrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency

1 for the Nonprofit Security Grant Program for grants to  
2 nonprofits under the State Homeland Security Grant Pro-  
3 gram.

4 (c) PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION.—In addition to  
5 amounts otherwise available, there is appropriated for fis-  
6 cal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not other-  
7 wise appropriated, \$5,000,000, to remain available until  
8 September 30, 2031, to the Administrator of the Federal  
9 Emergency Management Agency for the administration of  
10 the programs described in subsections (a) and (b).

11 **SEC. 50004. DHS OFFICE OF CHIEF READINESS SUPPORT**  
12 **OFFICER.**

13 In addition to the amounts otherwise available, there  
14 is appropriated to the Secretary of Homeland Security for  
15 fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not  
16 otherwise appropriated, \$900,000,000, to remain available  
17 until September 30, 2028, for the Office of the Chief  
18 Readiness Support Officer to carry out sustainability and  
19 environmental programs.

20 **SEC. 50005. GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION CLEAN**  
21 **FLEETS.**

22 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
23 appropriated to the Administrator of General Services for  
24 fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not  
25 otherwise appropriated, \$2,305,000,000, to remain avail-

1 able until September 30, 2026, for the procurement of  
2 zero-emission vehicles and necessary services, provided  
3 that such funds may not be used to acquire, install, or  
4 maintain equipment needed to charge or fuel zero-emission  
5 vehicles.

6 **SEC. 50006. GENERAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATION OFFICE**  
7 **OF INSPECTOR GENERAL.**

8 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
9 appropriated to the Office of Inspector General of the  
10 General Services Administration for fiscal year 2022, out  
11 of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,  
12 \$5,000,000, to remain available until September 30, 2031,  
13 to support oversight of General Services Administration  
14 activities implemented pursuant to this Act.

15 **SEC. 50007. UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE CLEAN**  
16 **FLEETS.**

17 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
18 appropriated to the United States Postal Service for fiscal  
19 year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise  
20 appropriated, the following amounts, to be deposited into  
21 the Postal Service Fund established under section 2003  
22 of title 39, United States Code:

23 (1) \$2,788,550,000, to remain available  
24 through September 30, 2031, for the purchase of  
25 zero-emission delivery vehicles.

1           (2) \$3,696,450,000, to remain available  
2 through September 30, 2031, for the purchase, de-  
3 sign, and installation of the requisite infrastructure  
4 to support zero-emission delivery vehicles at facilities  
5 that the United States Postal Service owns or leases  
6 from non-Federal entities.

7 **SEC. 50008. UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE OFFICE OF**  
8 **INSPECTOR GENERAL.**

9           In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
10 appropriated to the Office of Inspector General of the  
11 United States Postal Service for fiscal year 2022, out of  
12 any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,  
13 \$15,000,000, to remain available through September 30,  
14 2031, to support oversight of United States Postal Service  
15 activities implemented pursuant to this Act.

16 **SEC. 50009. GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY OFFICE OVER-**  
17 **SIGHT.**

18           In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
19 appropriated to the Comptroller General of the United  
20 States for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treas-  
21 ury not otherwise appropriated, \$25,000,000, to remain  
22 available until September 30, 2031, for necessary expenses  
23 of the Government Accountability Office to support the  
24 oversight of—



1           (1) the distribution and use of funds appro-  
2           priated under this Act; and

3           (2) whether the economic, social, and environ-  
4           mental impacts of the funds described in paragraph  
5           (1) are equitable.

6 **SEC. 50010. OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET OVER-**  
7           **SIGHT.**

8           In addition to amounts otherwise available, there are  
9           appropriated to the Director of the Office of Management  
10          and Budget for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the  
11          Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$25,000,000, to re-  
12          main available until September 30, 2026, for necessary ex-  
13          penses to—

14                 (1) oversee the implementation of this Act; and

15                 (2) track labor, equity, and environmental  
16          standards and performance.

17 **SEC. 50011. TECHNOLOGY MODERNIZATION FUND.**

18          In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
19          appropriated to the Administrator of General Services for  
20          fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not  
21          otherwise appropriated, \$250,000,000, to remain available  
22          until September 30, 2026, to carry out the purposes of  
23          the Technology Modernization Fund.

1 **SEC. 50012. FEDERAL CITIZEN SERVICES FUND.**

2 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
3 appropriated to the Administrator of General Services for  
4 fiscal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not  
5 otherwise appropriated, \$200,000,000, to remain available  
6 until September 30, 2026, to carry out the purposes of  
7 the Federal Citizen Services Fund.

8 **SEC. 50013. INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY OVERSIGHT AND**  
9 **REFORM FUND.**

10 In addition to amounts otherwise available, there is  
11 appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in  
12 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, to remain avail-  
13 able until September 30, 2026, \$50,000,000 for the Infor-  
14 mation Technology Oversight and Reform Fund.

15 **SEC. 50014. FEMA PFAS-FREE FIREFIGHTING GEAR.**

16 (a) IN GENERAL.—In addition to amounts otherwise  
17 available, there is appropriated for fiscal year 2022, out  
18 of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appropriated,  
19 \$95,000,000, to remain available until September 30,  
20 2030, to the Administrator of the Federal Emergency  
21 Management Agency for grants for personal protective  
22 firefighting equipment and firefighting foam that does not  
23 contain perfluoroalkyl or polyfluoroalkyl substances.

24 (b) PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION.—In addition to  
25 amounts otherwise available, there is appropriated for fis-  
26 cal year 2022, out of any money in the Treasury not other-

1 wise appropriated, \$5,000,000, to remain available until  
2 September 30, 2030, to the Administrator of the Federal  
3 Emergency Management Agency for the administration  
4 and management of this section.

5 (c) APPLICATIONS.—With respect to the grant pro-  
6 gram described in subsection (a), the Administrator of the  
7 Federal Emergency Management Agency shall—

8 (1) require applicants to submit an application  
9 at such time, in such form, and containing such in-  
10 formation and assurances as the Administrator of  
11 the Federal Emergency Management Agency may  
12 require; and

13 (2) establish appropriate review and delivery  
14 mechanisms for an application submitted under  
15 paragraph (1).

16 **SEC. 50015. FEMA RESILIENT BUILDING CODES.**

17 (a) IN GENERAL.—

18 (1) BRIC.—In addition to amounts otherwise  
19 available, there is appropriated for fiscal year 2022,  
20 out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise ap-  
21 propriated, \$145,500,000, to remain available until  
22 expended, to the Administrator of the Federal Emer-  
23 gency Management Agency for the Building Resil-  
24 ient Infrastructure and Communities program for  
25 activities and grants that provide technical assist-

1       ance and capacity building to establish, implement,  
2       and carry out enforcement activities of the latest  
3       published editions of relevant performance-based and  
4       consensus-based codes, specifications, and standards,  
5       including amendments made to those codes, speci-  
6       fications, and standards by State, local, Indian trib-  
7       al, or territorial governments during the adoption  
8       process, that incorporate the latest—

- 9               (A) hazard-resistant designs; and  
10              (B) requirements for the maintenance and  
11       inspection of existing buildings to address haz-  
12       ard risk.

13       (2) FEDERAL COST SHARE.—The Federal cost  
14       share for an activity or grant funded with amounts  
15       appropriated under paragraph (1) shall be 100 per-  
16       cent.

17       (b) ADMINISTRATION.—In addition to amounts oth-  
18       erwise available, there is appropriated for fiscal year 2022,  
19       out of any money in the Treasury not otherwise appro-  
20       priated, \$4,500,000, to remain available until September  
21       30, 2029, to the Administrator of the Federal Emergency  
22       Management Agency to administer the program described  
23       in subsection (a).

1 **SEC. 50016. FEMA BUILDING MATERIALS PROGRAM.**

2 Through September 30, 2026, the Administrator of  
3 the Federal Emergency Management Agency may provide  
4 financial assistance under sections 203(h), 404(a), and  
5 406(b) of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and  
6 Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5133(h), 42 U.S.C.  
7 5170c(a), 42 U.S.C. 5172(b)) for—

8 (1) costs associated with low-carbon materials;

9 and

10 (2) incentives that encourage low-carbon and  
11 net-zero energy projects, which may include an in-  
12 crease in the Federal cost share for those projects.

13 **SEC. 50017. FEMA MANAGEMENT AND ADMINISTRATION.**

14 In addition to amounts otherwise made available,  
15 there is appropriated to the account under the heading  
16 “Federal Emergency Management Agency—Operations  
17 and Support” for fiscal year 2022, out of any money in  
18 the Treasury not otherwise appropriated, \$2,500,000, to  
19 remain available until September 30, 2031, for the man-  
20 agement and administration of the grants, contracts, and  
21 cooperative agreements funded with amounts appropriated  
22 under section 50002.
